You are strong. You deserve safety. We believe in you.

Breaking the silence is an act of courage. You have the strength to take this step. Your safety matters, and we are ready to support you.

Create a safety plan:

- Always keep your phone charged and with you
- *Create* a daily check-in schedule with a trusted friend. Establish a code word that signals them to call the police.

Example: "Can you bring me that recipe?"

- Clear browser history after visiting support websites
- Prepare and hide an emergency bag containing:
 - ☐ Fresh clothes for you and your children
 - ☐ Essential contacts and phone numbers
 - ☐ Financial resources (cash, cards, checks)
 - ☐ Spare keys (home and car)
 - ☐ Important medications
 - Critical documents (protective orders, ID cards, birth certificates)

Remember: Taking the first step is the hardest, but you won't walk this path alone.
